



8. Baseline Survey and Need Assessment for JSW Cement Limited



The syllabus handbook elaborately discusses the curriculum structure and course content, the courses in the handbook are further classified as Knowledge Specialized (KS), Knowledge Fundamental (KF), Attitude (A), Skill (S) & Integrative (I). These courses are then blended with continuously updated inputs from the advisory meets on a regular basis. Thus at BIMTECH we follow a well-structured TLP to take care of learning outcomes in accordance with the objectives of the institution.

The institute was one of the first ten selections (out of the 3658 first round applicants). AIC- BIMTECH is one of a kind academia-industry- government partnership, driven by Atal Innovation Mission to create high-class incubation facilities with suitable infrastructure in terms of capital equipment and operating facilities. It is coupled with the availability of sector-wise experts for mentoring the start-ups so that these startup businesses can become successful entrepreneurs and enterprises.

As on September 30th 2019, Atal Incubation Centre- BIMTECH has supported 47 Startups since its operations started in January 2018. AIC-BIMTECH has created 157 jobs via the incubated startups supported till date. It has 54 partnerships, 21 mentors and 7 of its incubatees have raised 3.66 crores as funding. AIC-BIMTECH provides approx. INR 8.25 crores as benefits to its incubatees. AIC-BIMTECH focuses on creation of sustainable businesses through various public and private partnerships by providing domestic and international market access and capital.

Built over an area of more than 17,000 sqft, it also offers a facility of co-living space to its incubatees. AIC-BIMTECH is the only incubator in India offering a highly subsidized living arrangements for its incubatees.
